IC5146, the Cocoon Nebula, located some 2,500 light years distant in the Constellation Cygnus. The Nebula itself is some 15 light years in diameter; the bright star at its center is a massive type B approximately 15 times the mass of our sun and 20,000 times more luminous! Its radiation ionizes the hydrogen gas surrounding it giving the emission nebula its characteristic red color.
