

## The Beaver Moon Joins Jupiter in the Constellation Pisces

On the nights of **November 4 & 5**, the waxing gibbous Beaver Moon “sails” by the gas giant planet Jupiter in constellation Pisces, the Fishes. This year the Beaver Moon is “full” and totally eclipsed during the early morning hours of November 8<sup>th</sup>.

Jupiter is located some 389 million miles (35 light minutes) behind the Moon, and it’s in excellent position for telescopic observation of its 4 large Galilean moons and the striking atmospheric bands on its cloud tops. If you are fortunate, Jupiter may also be rotated so that its famous “great red spot” is visible.
