The Vernal Equinox – March 20th

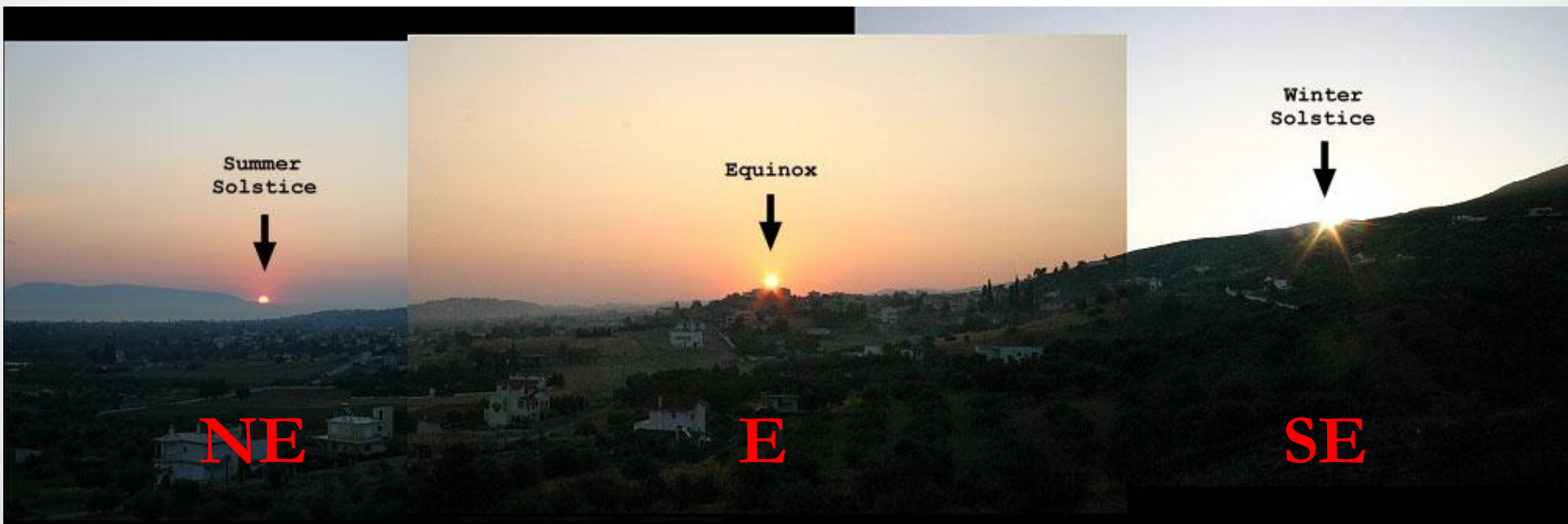
- ★ On **Friday, March 20th**, at 10:46 a.m. EDT, the Sun begins its journey north of the celestial equator, bringing spring to the northern hemisphere and autumn to the southern hemisphere. This event is called the “**vernal**” equinox in the northern hemisphere, when many plants are beginning to “**green**”.
- ★ On this day, all places on Earth experience nearly equal amounts of daylight and darkness – about 12 hours of each. “**Equinox**” literally means “**equal night**”.
- ★ For all places on Earth at the equinox, the Sun rises due east and sets due west.
